## **Biographical Information**

John O. Pastore (1907-2000) played a pivotal role in both state and national politics during the middle of the 20th century. Pastore was born on March 17, 1907 in Providence, Rhode Island. He studied law at Northeastern University, graduating in 1931 and was admitted to the bar in 1932.

After a few years of practicing law in Providence, Pastore won his first election in 1935 as a member of the Rhode Island House of Representatives and never lost an election throughout his entire political career. Pastore served as the assistant attorney general of Rhode Island from 1937-1938 and again from 1940-1944 before assuming the office of the Governor of Rhode Island in 1945, succeeding J. Howard McGrath.

In 1950, following the resignation of McGrath, Pastore was elected as a Democrat, winning a seat in the United States Senate where he would serve until his retirement in 1976. In retirement Pastore returned to Rhode Island where he continued to serve as a statesman for the Democratic Party and became involved in the local business community.

Pastore was the first Italian-American Governor and U.S. Senator in the nation and this played a major role in his actions at the local, state and national level. At the state and local level, Pastore, coming from an ethnic background, was no stranger to the suffering brought on by the Great Depression and the many obstacles faced by the ethnic communities of Rhode Island. Recognizing the needs of his constituents, Pastore worked hard to create greater economic and political opportunities for these groups. At the national level he continued his lobbying to strengthen Rhode Island's industrial base, especially the fading textile industry, and by introducing legislation that promoted the well-being of many ethnic groups.

During his tenure as Senator, Pastore was very involved in both the Kennedy and Johnson administrations and had significant influence on policy and committee decisions. He was an avid supporter of Great Society legislation, was central to the passing of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and during that same year he delivered a widely popular keynote address for the Democratic National Convention--often called "The Speech Heard Round the World."

Some of Pastore's most notable achievements came from his active role in the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy where he supported the peaceful use of atomic energy and aided in the passage of the 1963 Limited Nuclear Test Ban and the 1969 Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaties. Pastore was also very involved in the Senate Commerce Subcommittee on Communications where he advocated for the 1962 establishment of the Communications Satellite Corporation and the 1967 Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

Known for his height (5'4"), his booming voice and passion for helping those he represented, Pastore quickly became one of Rhode Island's most popular, influential and respected figures. At the age of 93, Pastore passed away on July 15, 2000.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection of John O. Pastore (1907-2000) highlights a long career in public service at the state and national level, spanning from his time as Rhode Island State Representative, Rhode Island Assistant Attorney General, Governor of Rhode Island, and United States Senator.

The bulk of the collection deals with the later part of his years in Washington. This material consists of documents on Committee service (e.g., Joint Committee on Atomic Energy and Senate Commerce Subcommittee on Communications), public and private speeches, significant correspondence with prominent political figures and organizational leaders, legislative reports, congressional records, election materials, and photographs.

#### Arrangement

The collection is arranged into ten series, with each series arranged chronologically. The series containing the News Clippings and Subject Files are arranged alphabetically.

## **Scope and Content Note**

This series contains items of memorabilia from Pastore's years in office. The series primarily consists of oversized items, including photographs and certificates, scrapbooks containing news clippings, original prints of political cartoons, photograph albums, plaques, and awards.

Other notable materials include a 48 Star U.S. Flag, the Rhode Island State Flag, materials from the Atomic Energy Commission's Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty of 1963 and memorabilia from America's Bicentennial celebration.

## **Scope and Content Note**

This series contains clippings from newspapers and magazines that pertain to Pastore from about 1955-1976, during his time as a U.S. Senator. These clippings include segments from speeches that he gave, articles about legislation he worked on, campaign advertisements, and political cartoons. Some of the most popular subjects are Atomic Energy, Communications, Foreign Relations, the Navy, Rhode Island, and Vietnam.

## **Scope and Content Note**

This series contains correspondence from prominent figures that Pastore was in contact with during his years in office. Some of the more notable figures include Presidents Truman, Kennedy (and family), Johnson, Nixon, Vice President Hubert Humphrey, Senators T.F. Green, Claiborne Pell, Giovanni Leone, the President of Italy, along with many others.

The series consists of office memorandums and correspondence, thank you letters, notes of congratulation and requests for Pastore's support on legislation or actions. This correspondence is primarily political in nature. Additional correspondence can be found in the Biographical Information series and the Subject Files series.

## **Scope and Content Note**

This series contains speeches and remarks made by Pastore throughout his long career. This is the largest series in the collection. These speeches cover a wide variety of topics, but mainly consist of his speeches given at public and private events, award or anniversary ceremonies, and remarks for radio or television stations. Folders include speeches, drafts and some awards, along with photographs that were generated by these events. In addition, many of these folders also include audio tapes or films of the speeches.

Boxes 18 through 22 contain extensive material on Pastore's Democratic National Convention speech given in 1964, along with extensive correspondence regarding his speech - mainly congratulatory notes and requests for copies. Some of the awards and photographs accompanying these speeches are in the oversized section of the collection.
